Constitution and By-Laws

Articles

I. Name: The Sun and Fun Tri County Senior Softball League, Inc., a “Not for Profit Corporation”

II. Objective: The goal of this organization is to provide an opportunity for players living in adult communities to participate in a competitive softball league with a focus on Safety, Fairness, Good Sportsmanship and Camaraderie within the participating communities.

III. Membership: Membership is open to any adult community within the (Tri Counties area including Lake, Marion, and Sumter). If and when a need arises to add team(s) that are not listed as member communities, the Executive Board will review each special circumstance and approve that team(s) request to play in the appropriate division determined by the operations committee with an approval vote of two thirds (2/3) of the majority of the Executive Board.

Team(s) are limited to 1 playing season with a review each successive year by the **operations committee** and the approval of the Executive Board consisting of the same two thirds (2/3) majority vote.

Section I. Officers:

President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer. The officers are elected to two year terms.

The terms are split into bi-yearly elections with the President and Secretary-Treasurer one year and the Vice President the other. This is done to insure continuity within the league.

Section II. Duties:

President:

- a. Preside over all meetings, including special meeting when required.
- b. Make appointments to vacant offices, positions or committee's as needed.
- c. Oversee the leagues financial status with the league treasurer.
- d. Make decisions pertaining to league operations until the Executive Board can meet.
- e. Chair the operations committee meetings.

Vice President:

- a. Succeed the president if that position becomes vacant.
- b. Assume the presidents duties in his/her absence.
- c. Chair the protest committee, appointing communities to serve on this committee.
- d. Oversee and assist the divisional representatives within their respective divisions.

Secretary-Treasurer:

- a. Record the minutes of all scheduled Executive Board meetings and those call by the president.
- b. Publish recorded minutes of all Executive Board meetings and those called by the president.
- c. Publish Executive Board meeting minutes to the webmaster within 10 days of the meeting date.
- d. Collect and record monies received or spent by the league.
- e. Provide a detailed record of all transactions when requested by the President or Executive Board.

Section III. Governing Body:

- a. **The Executive Board is the governing body of the Sun and Fun Tri County Senior Softball League Inc.**
- b. Membered communities shall name **one (1) person** to represent their community on the Board.
- c. Each community representative shall have **one (1) vote** in matters pertaining to league operations.
- d. The president cannot be a community representative nor vote unless of a tie vote.
- e. No league business is conducted without a Quorum, consisting of two thirds (2/3) of the membership.

f. All voted on decisions by the Executive Board are deemed final.

Section IV. League Dues:

- a. Dues are determined by Executive Board at the annual meeting in April of each year.
- b. The president can ask the Executive Board for special assessments if deemed necessary.
- c. The current dues assessment for the 2017-18 operating year will be \$30.00.
- d. Dues are payable in October of each operating year to the Secretary-Treasurer.

Section V. Committees:

Operations: Consists of the three (3) elected officers and the six (6) division representatives.

- Conduct meetings to align each division prior to the first meeting in October.
- Conduct league business if required between scheduled meetings.

Protest Committee: The committee has three (3) members chaired by the vice president.

- Additional members include divisional representative of game being protested.
- One (1) additional community representative appointed by the vice president.
- The committee will rule on the game being protested.
- Procedures for protests are covered in league rule #7.
- Decisions by the committee are deemed final.

Section VI:

Amendments:

These By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote when a quorum is present at a regular scheduled or special meeting. A quorum consists of two thirds (2/3) of the Executive Board.
